The national NALC's bulletin from the CX has this note seeking information to assist in making a response to a Select Committee inquiry.

This week the Communities and Local Government Committee announced an inquiry into Brexit and the impacts that will have on local government as well as looking at which powers currently held by the EU could be transferred to town halls after the UK's exit, and examining the risks and opportunities posed to local government in a post Brexit Britain. As part of the inquiry, the Communities and Local Government Committee are asking for written submissions on the points below:

- What are the greatest risks, and opportunities, for local government posed by Brexit?
- What measures should the Government take to provide more certainty and stability for local government in light of Brexit?
- What powers could be devolved from the EU directly to local authorities?
- The extent to which local government's voice is being heard in the Brexit negotiations and how representation could be improved.
